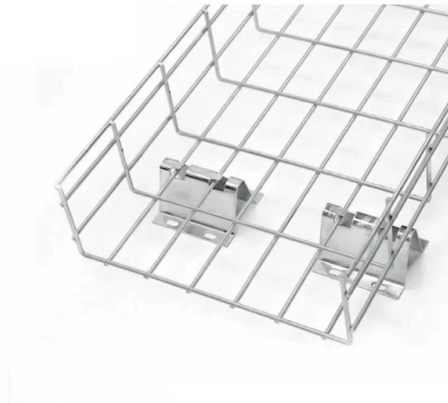

Z-Shaped Cable Tray Configurations Z-shaped cable trays, such as the 70° Z-Cable Rack, are pre-fabricated or can be custom-cut to create angled transitions in cable routing . These configurations are useful for navigating around obstacles or changing elevation in cable management systems. When cutting or modifying trays into Z-shapes:

- Measure and mark the cut points accurately to maintain the correct angle and alignment.
- Maintain structural integrity by avoiding excessive thinning or weakening of the tray at the bend points.
- Consider the spacing of crosspieces and support points to ensure the tray can safely carry the intended cable load .

Material and Coating Considerations

- ZM-coated steel: Self-healing zinc layer protects cut edges; minor rust may appear temporarily .
- Stainless steel or aluminum trays: Cutting may expose raw metal, but corrosion resistance is generally high.
- FRP trays: Cutting requires dust control and protective equipment; edges remain stable and safe to ha...
