

Can BV wires be run inside cable trays

Non-flame-retardant wires like BV are not recommended here. Basket-style trays: Can accommodate small, string-level wires, but again, BV wires are not ideal due to fire safety concerns. Slot boxes: Enclosed metal trays that provide mechanical protection and are suitable for BV wires, especially in ceilings or areas with concentrated wiring. Practical Recommendations Use BV wires only in metal slot boxes for distribution lines to comply with safety standards and reduce fire risk. Consider flame-retardant alternatives like WDZ-BYJ wires if installation in cable trays is necessary, as they are low-smoke, halogen-free, and flame-retardant. Avoid stacking or overcrowding wires in trays, as this can lead to heat buildup and compromise insulation integrity. Ensure proper grounding of metallic cable trays if used, although BV wires themselves sho...
