It uses a latch mechanism similar to an RJ45 plug, providing secure connections in tight spaces. LC connectors are widely used in duplex or simplex configurations and are the preferred choice for high-efficiency cabling.

SC (Subscriber Connector / Standard Connector) SC connectors feature a square shape with a push-pull coupling mechanism and a 2.5mm ferrule. They are commonly used in FTTH deployments, data centers, and CATV networks. SC/APC variants are particularly suitable for applications requiring low return loss, such as GPON networks or RF video systems.

ST (Straight Tip) ST connectors are recognized by their bayonet-style twist-lock mechanism and 2.5mm ferrule. They are durable and reliable, often used in legacy networks, industrial environments, and multimode systems. While less common in modern networks, ST connectors remain relevant where robust mechanical connections are needed.

FC (Ferrule Connector) FC connectors use a threaded coupling design, providing a highly secure connection in high-vibration environments such as factories, railway networks, or aviation systems. They are often used in precision instruments like OTDRs and long-distance single-mode fiber applications.

MPO/MTP (Multi-Fiber Push-On / Multi-Fiber Termination Push-On) MPO/MTP connectors support multiple fibers in a single connection, making them ideal for high-bandwidth applications, cloud computing, and large-scale data centers. They are designed for high-density cabling and can handle 12, 24, or more fibers in a single connector.
