Screws should be inserted from the inner side of the tray to avoid cable damage.
4. **Angle and Adjustable Connectors** When routing trays around corners or creating rises and drops, angle or adjustable connectors are used. Cover plates are attached in the same manner as straight sections, ensuring continuous protection and maintaining aesthetics.

Alignment: Ensure the cover plate is flush with the tray edges to prevent gaps that could expose cables.

Fastener Selection: Use the correct bolts, nuts, or clamps recommended by the tray manufacturer to maintain structural integrity.
