Material Costs Fiber optic cable itself varies by strand count and type: single-mode fiber typically costs \$0.10–\$0.50 per foot, multimode \$0.30–\$1.00 per foot, while high-count backbone cables (288 fibers) can reach \$6 per foot. Conduit and ducting costs depend on diameter and material; placing fiber into existing empty conduits is generally cheaper than installing new ducts.

Labor and Installation Labor is a significant cost driver, influenced by trenching, handhole placement, splicing, and testing. For example, a project placing 1,856,332 ft of 864-fiber cable into existing conduits included handhole installation, maintenance loops, and GPS documentation, reflecting the detailed labor and project management required.

- Handhole placement: \$1,000–\$3,000 per unit depending on size and site conditions.
- Splicing and testing: Costs vary with fiber count and number of splice points, typically included in per-foot pricing for large projects.
