

Core switch detects link faults



Overview

The common cause for link flapping is usually related to bad, unsupported, or non-standard cable or Small Form-Factor Pluggable (SFP) or related to other link synchronization issues. If you have physical access to the switch, it can save time to look at the port LEDs which give you the link status or can indicate an error condition (if red or orange). By understanding and resolving these issues, you can maintain a resilient network infrastructure. If the entire switch is unresponsive, or. A port flap, also referred to as a link flap, is a situation in which a physical interface on the switch continually goes up and down, three or more times a second for duration of at least ten seconds. The root cause of these issues tend to be simple in nature, such as a failing optic/transceiver or bad medium (like a damaged fiber or copper cable). I'm sure I removed the correct VLANs. When Switch-2's Ethernet1/2 interface receives the Remote Fault message, it will know that Switch-1 is no longer receiving valid data from Switch-2, indicating that the link is unhealthy.

Ethernet OAM Fault Advertisement

Ethernet OAM detects faults in Ethernet links and advertises fault information to interfaces or other protocol modules. Ethernet OAM fault advertisement is implemented by an OAM manager

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
