4. Utilize Patch Panels and D-Rings Patch panels act as central hubs for network connections. Installing a horizontal cable manager or D-ring below the patch panel allows excess patch cords to be aligned neatly with switches and servers. D-rings guide cables along the rack edges, reducing tension and maintaining a clean layout.
5. Leave Room for Future Expansion Plan cable slack with future growth in mind. Avoid tightly packing excess cable; instead, leave enough length to accommodate equipment changes or upgrades without creating clutter.
