These markers help installers track how much cable has been deployed and how much remains on the reel, which is essential for accurate splicing and routing.
- 3. Fiber Color Coding** Individual fibers within a multi-fiber cable are color-coded according to the TIA/EIA-598-D standard. This standard defines outer jacket colors, inner fiber sequences, and connector/boot colors to identify fiber type (singlemode or multimode) and strand position. For example, the first 12 fibers follow a repeating color sequence: Blue, Orange, Green, Brown, Slate, White, Red, Black, Yellow, Violet, Rose, Aqua. This sequence repeats for cables with more than 12 fibers.
- 4. Cable Type and Compliance Markings** Lead-in markings often indicate fire performance ratings such as OFNR (Riser), OFNP (Plenum), OFNG (General Purpose), or LSZH (Low Smoke Zero Halogen). Additional markings may show compliance with ISO, IEC, or UL standards, ensuring the cable meets safety, performance, and environmental requirements.
