- Optical Network Terminal (ONT):** Converts light signals from the fiber into electrical data for your home network. It is typically installed inside or just outside the home and must be powered.
- Router or Gateway:** Distributes the data from the ONT to your devices via Wi-Fi or Ethernet. Modern routers supporting Wi-Fi 6 or higher are recommended for optimal performance.
- Ethernet Cable:** Connects the ONT to the router. High-quality cables like CAT6 or better ensure stable, high-speed data transfer.

Installation Process

- Site Assessment:** A technician evaluates your property and prepares the connection from the neighborhood fiber network.
- Fiber Drop Installation:** The fiber cable is run from the distribution point to your home, either underground or overhead.
- NID and ONT Setup:** The fiber is connected to the NID outside, then routed to the ONT inside, which converts light signals to electrical data.
- Router Connection:** The ONT is linked to your router via Ethernet, enabling Wi-Fi or wired connections throughout your home.
- Testing and Activation:** The technician powers the system, tests the connection, and ensures full speed and signal quality.
