Outer Jacket and Connector Colors The outer jacket color indicates the fiber type and mode: Single-mode (OS2): Yellow Multimode OM1/OM2: Orange Multimode OM3/OM4: Aqua Multimode OM4 (some manufacturers): Erika Violet Multimode OM5: Lime Green Connector boots also follow color conventions to indicate polish type and fiber mode, such as blue for UPC single-mode and green for APC single-mode.
