- Fast access:** Serving as the nearest terminal device to connect ONUs, switches, or PCs.

Terminal boxes can be wall-mounted or desktop units and are often used in FTTH (Fiber to the Home) deployments for quick and reliable connections.

Fiber Optic Distribution Box A fiber optic distribution box (FDB) acts as an intermediate node between feeder cables and subscriber drop cables. Key characteristics include:

- Distribution function:** Splits and routes fibers from the main feeder to multiple subscribers.
- Port capacity:** Typically 4-48 ports, depending on network size and application.
- Installation environments:** Indoor corridors, building stairways, outdoor walls, or pole-mounted setups.
- Protection and durability:** Dustproof, waterproof, and mechanically robust to safeguard fiber splices and adapters.

Distribution boxes are widely used in FTTH, FTTB, and FTTX networks to manage multiple subscriber connections efficiently.
