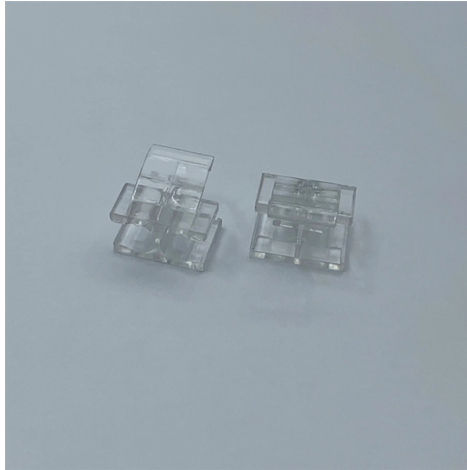

Options include halocarbon, gas, or water mist systems, which are compatible with sensitive IT equipment and help maintain business continuity.
