Spacing from Other Structures: Ensure the tray is positioned to avoid interference with other equipment, walls, or ceilings, maintaining proper airflow and safety distances. 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If the system is outdoor and is supporting a sizable cable load, each section of cable tray may need to be securely attached to the structure with heavy-duty bolt-through hold-down clamps.
