Aim for a pigtail length that allows for comfortable connections without taking up excessive space. In larger boxes, you have more leeway, but avoid unnecessary length.

How to Pigtail Wires for a Safe Electrical Connection

Begin by cutting the pigtail wire to a suitable length, generally between six and eight inches, to allow enough slack for comfortable work outside the electrical box.
