Port Density Considerations The exact number of ports depends on the network size, device density, and power requirements. Access switches are often deployed in stacks or groups to accommodate larger floors or offices, with each switch providing dozens of ports while maintaining a manageable number of uplinks. High port density reduces cabling complexity and allows for future expansion without adding extra hardware.
