

How much right-angle steel is typically used for cable trays



Overview

Fill Limits: For power cables, the fill must not exceed 40% of the tray's cross-sectional area; for control cables, it's 50%. The right electrical cable tray support ensures that the cables in your system are securely held in place and protected from external factors. Rod supports and angle steel supports are two common types, each with its own unique features and applications. The proper selection between the two depends. Cable tray support quantity can be calculated using a simple formula:
$$\text{Support Quantity} = \text{Total Length} \div \text{Support Spacing} + 1$$
$$20 \div 2 + 1 = 11 \text{ supports}$$
In a typical project, a 20-meter cable tray with 2-meter spacing requires 11 supports. These systems, made from metal or plastic, are open structures designed to support electrical conductors, ensuring proper organization and safety.
