Long-distance or high-bandwidth backbones: SMF is preferred due to lower attenuation and higher bandwidth capacity.

**Breakout:** Individual strands for direct connections.  
**Distribution:** Strands grouped in a  $900\text{ }\mu\text{m}$  jacket for splicing.

**Micro-module:** Designed for mass splicing and large-scale deployments.

**Indoor:** Flexible, fire-resistant LSZH (Low Smoke Zero Halogen) jackets.  
**Outdoor:** Black HDPE jackets for UV and weather resistance.  
**Indoor/Outdoor hybrid:** Black LSZH for combined protection.
- Select Connectors and Fiber Count**  
**Connectors:** Ensure compatibility with existing transceivers and network equipment.  
**Fiber count:** Choose based on network capacity needs, ranging from 1 to 288 fibers per cable.  
**High-density options:** MTP®/MPO cables can integrate up to 32 fibers in a single connector, supporting 40G/100G/400...
