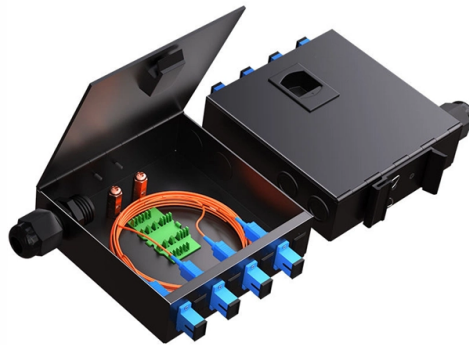


How to check if there is a circuit in the distribution box

How to Test Set the multimeter to the appropriate mode (voltage, continuity, or current). Measure voltage at the main input and at each outgoing circuit. For continuity, turn off the breaker and test between the breaker terminal and the load end. Replace or repair any circuit showing abnormal readings or no continuity.
