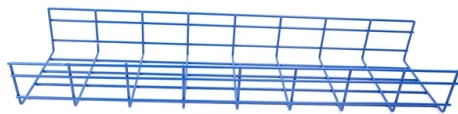


# How to connect a four-core optical cable and optical fiber
