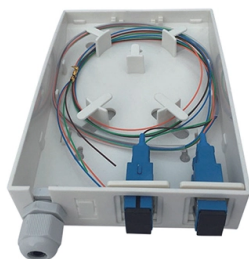

Splicing: Fusion splice the incoming fiber cores to pigtails inside the terminal box. Each fiber core is typically connected to a corresponding pigtail using a splice tray or cassette.
Adapter Connection: Insert the pigtail connectors into the fiber adapters (flanges) in the terminal box. These adapters allow connection to jumpers or patch cords leading to network devices.
