Use a small unmanaged switch to add multiple devices while maintaining network speed and reliability. Ensure the switch is connected to a router port, and then connect your devices to the switch. This setup allows all devices to access the network without speed penalties or the need for multiple splitters . In summary, while splitters can be convenient for running two connections over a single cable, they cannot expand the number of available router ports. A switch is the proper solution for adding more devices to a fully occupied network.
