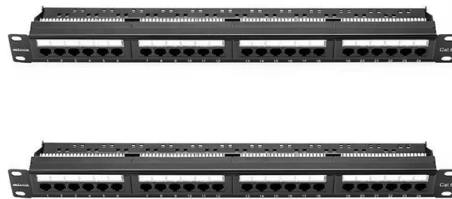

Typical EMF levels near small distribution boxes are much lower than those near high-voltage transmission lines and generally fall within safe limits.

Noise and Environmental Comfort Distribution boxes can produce a low-frequency hum (100–240 Hz, around 45–60 dBA at the fence line), similar to a refrigerator at close range. This noise diminishes with distance and can be mitigated through soundproofing, landscaping, or strategic placement of fences. Visual and acoustic stressors can affect comfort, but thoughtful design and setbacks can reduce these impacts.
