

Methods for disconnecting cables from distribution boxes

Always turn off power, verify circuits are de-energized, and safely cap or remove cables when disconnecting from a distribution box. **Safety First** Before touching any cables, switch off the main breaker or the specific circuit breaker supplying the distribution box. Implement a Lockout/Tagout (LOTO) procedure to prevent accidental re-energization, using a lock or tag on the breaker. Always wear personal protective equipment (PPE), including insulated gloves and safety glasses, since line-side wires may still carry voltage. **Verify Power is Off** Use a non-contact voltage tester (NCVT) for a quick check, but confirm with a digital multimeter using a “live-dead-live” sequence: test the meter on a known live source, then check all terminals in the box (phase-to-phase, phase-to-neutral, phase-to-ground), and finally re-test the meter on the live source. This ensures the box is safe to work on. **Disconnecting Cables** Identify the cables: Determine which wires are incoming (line side) and outgoing (load side) to other units or circuits. **Loosen terminal screws:** Use a torque screwdriver to carefully loosen the screws on the terminal blocks or busbars holding the cables. **Remove the cable:** Gently pull the cable out of the terminal. If the cable is stapled or routed through walls, cut and leave a visible, capped segment for future reference. **Cap unused wires:** For any disconnected hot or neutral wires, use wire nuts or insulated caps to prevent accidental contact. Ensure the ground wire remains properly terminated or isolated. **Cable Management** Keep wires neat using cable ties or channels to avoid crossing or tangling. Label each disconnected wire clearly to indicate its previous connection or circuit for future maintenance. If the distribution box connects to another unit, ensure an external fuse is installed before reconnecting or leaving the cable disconnected. **Final Checks** Verify all disconnected wires are saf...
