Secondary Distribution Boxes

Secondary distribution boxes, also called sub-distribution boxes, act as intermediate panels that distribute power from the primary box to specific buildings, floors, or zones. Key aspects include:

- Construction:** Feature inner and outer doors, powder-coated exteriors, rainproof tops, and copper busbars for main connections.
- Protection:** Contain large three-phase circuit breakers and RCDs to protect equipment and personnel.
- Function:** Route electricity to tertiary distribution boxes or directly to equipment in a controlled and safe manner.
- Design Principle:** Part of a three-tier protection system, ensuring that each zone or building has dedicated protection and isolation. Secondary boxes are often installed per bui...
