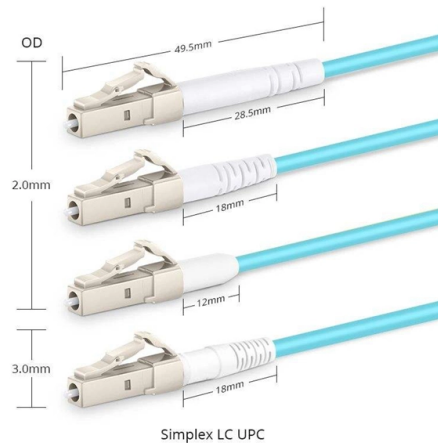


Quickly thread network cables through cable trays

Start from the far end: Pull cables from the termination point back toward the source to maintain control and reduce snags. Use horizontal and vertical elbows strategically: Minimize sharp bends to prevent cable stress and signal degradation.
