Use a high-quality Ethernet cable (Cat6 or better) to connect the ONT's LAN port to the router's WAN port.

Power on the router and confirm connectivity through indicator lights or the router's configuration interface.

Optimal Router Placement

Place the router centrally within the home or office for best Wi-Fi coverage. Avoid placing the router inside the fiber drop box; these boxes are not ventilated and can overheat or restrict airflow.

Testing and Maintenance

Verify signal strength and internet speed using a fiber optic power meter or speed test. Schedule periodic checks to ensure fiber connections remain clean, secure, and free from stress or bending.
