

Spacing between 10KV cable trays and low-voltage cable trays



Overview

Below are some common safety spacing requirements: 1. Parallel Wiring of Power and Low Voltage Cables 130mm if both cables are in non-metallic conduits or cable trays. When wiring in non-explosive hazardous areas, the safety spacing between different types of cables varies depending on factors such as the type of cable and the method of installation. Proper installation can significantly reduce electromagnetic interference, prevent fire hazards, and improve overall efficiency.
