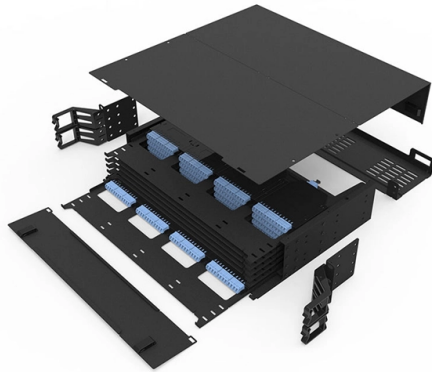


Standard network cabinet mounting

Network cabinets and racks must comply with 19-inch EIA standards, with 1.75-inch rack units, proper front-to-back rail spacing, and secure mounting to support equipment safely. Rack and Cabinet Types Network cabinets typically fall into two main types: standard 19-inch four-post EIA racks and two-post Telco racks, both conforming to ANSI/EIA-310-D-1992 standards for English universal hole spacing. These standards ensure compatibility with most network switches, servers, and other rack-mounted equipment. Rack Unit (RU) and Vertical Spacing 1 Rack Unit (1U) = 1.75 inches (4.45 cm) vertical space. Equipment should be mounted in multiples of 1U to align with standard mounting holes. The front opening between rack flanges must be 17.75 inches (45.1 cm) minimum, with the outer edges of front-mounting brackets extending to 19 inches (48.26 cm). Front-to-Back Rail Spacing For four-post racks, the distance between the outside faces of front and rear rails should be 23.6 to 36 inches (60 to 91.4 cm) to accommodate rear brackets and airflow. Rear clearance from chassis to perforated doors should be at least 3 inches (7.6 cm) to allow proper airflow. Front mounting rails should be offset from the front door by 3 inches (7.6 cm) minimum, or 5 inches (12.7 cm) if cable management brackets are installed. Mounting Hole and Rail Standards Mounting holes follow English universal spacing per ANSI/EIA-310-D, allowing devices to be mounted in any compliant rack. Horizontal spacing between rails must accommodate the device chassis, with approved wing devices used if necessary to narrow the opening. Structural and Safety Considerations Racks must be strong enough to support the total weight of installed equipment. Secure racks to the building structure, floor, ceiling, or wall brackets for stability, especially in earthquake-prone areas. Ensure side clearance for airflow and avoid obstructions near chassis air intake or exhaust vents.
