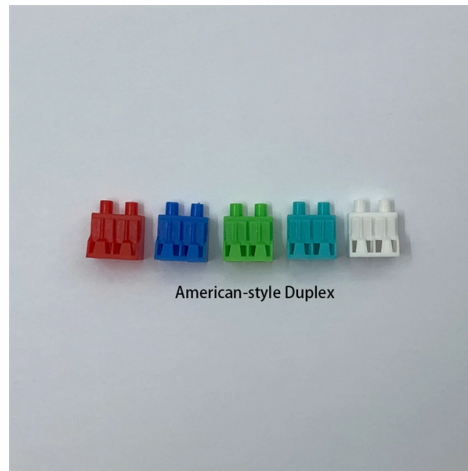


The Role of the Core Switch Matrix
