- Junction Box Connection** Once terminated, fibers are routed into the junction box, secured in splice trays or adapters, and organized to maintain bend radius and prevent damage (). This step usually takes 5–10 minutes, depending on the number of fibers and box complexity.

- Technician Experience:** Skilled technicians can complete the process faster and with fewer errors.
- Number of Fibers:** Multi-fiber cables or high-density junction boxes increase handling time.
- Tools and Equipment:** Using high-quality strippers, cleavers, and splicers reduces preparation and termination time.
- Environmental Conditions:** Clean, well-lit work areas improve efficiency and reduce mistakes ().
