26 (A) (2) "Width of Working Space" requires the working space to be at least 30 inches in width or the width of the equipment whichever is greater. This section further requires that in all cases the door or hinged panel of the equipment must open at least 90°. Typical wall-mount enclosure sizes often range from about 200 × 200 × 120 mm up to 800 × 600 × 300 mm. Freestanding cabinets commonly range from about 1600–2200 mm in height, 600–1800 mm in width, and 300–600 mm in depth. The right size depends on internal layout, cable entry space, bend radius. Clearance: Electrical panels must be installed in a readily accessible area with a minimum clearance of 30 inches (762 mm) wide, 3 ft (36 inches or 914 mm) deep, and 6.5 feet (≈ 2 meter) high in front of the panel. The panelboard's door (hinged cover) shall be able to be opened to a full 90°. Effective internal layouts focus on organized component placement, efficient cable management, and thermal management.
