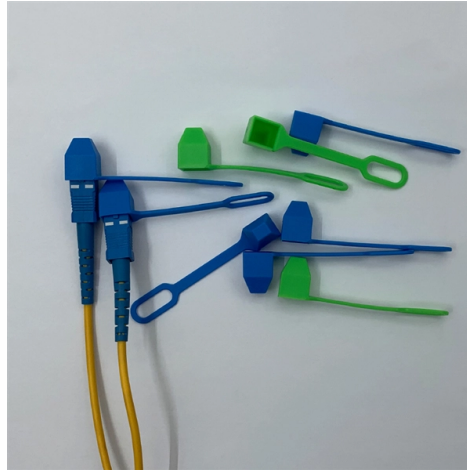

Size requirements: NEC specifies minimum wire sizes for grounding conductors, usually no smaller than 12 AWG for typical branch circuits, with larger conductors for main feeders or high-capacity equipment.
