How They Work Together
 Fiber optic cables often connect switches across long distances or high-traffic areas. For example, in a corporate network, fiber might link the main switch in a data center to switches in other buildings, while the switches manage local traffic within each building. Without switches, devices cannot communicate efficiently, and without fiber, high-speed long-distance connections are limited.
