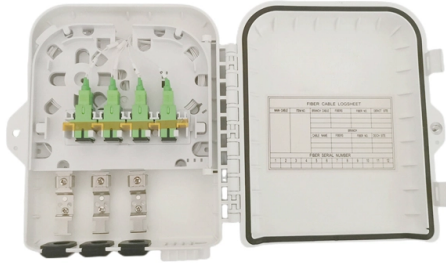


Which port on the fiber optic cable connects to the router

By following this setup, your router receives the internet feed via its WAN port, allowing you to distribute the connection to devices through Wi-Fi or Ethernet.
