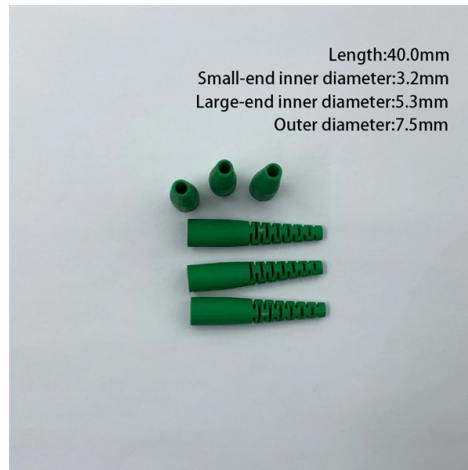


Why do optical modules cost more than copper connections



Overview

Because fiber optic SFP+ modules are made for long-distance transmission over fiber cable connections, which requires more sophisticated and costly technology, they are typically more expensive.
