

Wiring of outdoor optical distribution box

Choosing and Installing the Box Outdoor optical distribution boxes (ODBs) are designed to terminate, protect, and manage fiber optic cables in harsh environments. They should meet at least IP65 standards for waterproofing and dustproofing, and be made of durable, UV-resistant materials to withstand sunlight and impact. Install the box on a flat, load-bearing wall or pole, avoiding unstable or decorative surfaces, and ensure it is at a suitable height (typically 2.8–3.2 meters above ground for outdoor installations).

Cable Preparation Strip the outer and inner jackets of the fiber optic cable carefully, removing any filling compounds and cleaning the fibers. Wrap insulation tape around the stripped area to protect the fibers. Insert the cable through the entry ports at the bottom of the box and fix the strength members (steel core) on the fiber fixing board.

Fiber Routing and Protection Divest the loose tubes using a stripping clamp and protect fibers with fiber protection tubes. Keep fiber coiling lengths short to prevent breakage during handling. Use splice trays to organize pigtails and splices, securing them with nylon ties. Ensure the fiber path allows the front panel or drawer of the box to be fully extended without tension on the fibers, typically leaving at least 31 inches of slack for trunk cables.

Splitter and Adapter Installation Install PLC or FBT splitters on the designated fixing panel inside the box. Plug pigtail connectors into adapters and coil excess fiber neatly in the splice tray. Use nylon ties and protective tubes to secure fibers at entry points and around splitters.

Securing and Final Checks Fix the box with expansion screws or bolts, ensuring it is level and stable. Seal all cable entry points with hose clamps or cable seals to maintain waterproofing. Label fibers and ports for easy identification and future maintenance. Verify that fibers are not bent...
